The attached preliminary plans are being furnished to aid prospective Bidders in identifying the location and type of work for this project. The project will be advertised during a period when viewing of the project may not be possible due to snow. Therefore, prospective Bidders are encouraged to view the project during fall as conditions permit. After November 1st, access will be weather dependent; contact the Boundary County – Road and Bridge department for current conditions at (208) 267-3838. No Federal Highway Administration personnel will be available for show-me tours.

Project Location and Type of Work - This project is located in Boundary County, Idaho, just west of Bonners Ferry. The project limits are from the Bonners Ferry City Limit to the Kootenai National Wildlife Refuge Visitor Center. Approximate GPS coordinates of the start of project are 48.69365° N, -116.3309°W and the end of the project are 48.706968° N, -116.415742°W.

The proposed project consists of improving access to the Kootenai National Wildlife Refuge and to federally-managed lands along the Kootenai River. The scope of the project includes:

- Improve safety by improving sight distance on several curves within the project limits,
- Widen the existing road from approx. 20 feet to 32 feet,
- Provide widened shoulders for pedestrians and bicyclists,
- Correct deficient superelevation,
- Upgrading of bridge rail on Deep Creek Bridge,
- Upgrading of guardrail.

Special Notice - Fall Weed Inspection May be Necessary

All material sources and materials incorporated into the work must be certified to be free from noxious weeds, invasive plants, and other deleterious materials by a federal, state or local public agency. Commercial certifications may be acceptable if materials have been certified through the

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North American Weed Free Forage Program standard or a similarly recognized certification process .
To determine if a source is acceptable, contractors must arrange for a weed inspection this Fall.
