5. Description: Pyrolyzer furnace system

This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial items prepared in accordance with the format in FAR Subpart 12.6, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; proposals are being requested and a written solicitation will not be issued

The solicitation document and incorporated provisions and clauses are those in effect through FAR FAC 2022-06 May 26, 2022. For purposes of this acquisition, the associated NAICS code is 334516.

Line Item Structure: The following is a contract line item number(s), quantities, and units of measure, (including option(s), if applicable):

Line Item 0001 – pyrolyzer furnace system Line Item 0002- Installation and calibration of pyrolyzer furnace system

Line Item 0003- Test and verification of full equipment functionality

Line Item 0004- Onsite training on basic operations and familiarization of the instrument shall be provided at the time of installation.

Background

Routine analysis of foods for the presence and levels of radionuclides is an important component of FDA's food safety monitoring efforts. The greatest potential for accidental contamination results from nuclear power generation, both domestically and abroad. As part of the Radionuclides in Food Compliance Program, domestic samples are collected in areas near nuclear power plants and import samples are collected from countries most likely to have food products with radionuclide contamination. These monitoring efforts enable FDA to respond to nuclear accidents and to identify sources of radionuclide contamination. The Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Winchester Engineering and Analytical Center (WEAC) is the only FDA laboratory that performs analysis of tritium and other radionuclides in foods as a part of FDA's food safety surveillance and compliance programs.

Purpose

This document describes WEAC's need for a sample pyrolyzer to monitor the radioactivity associated with tritium so that CFSAN can ensure the safety of fish and seafood captured after exposure to nuclear plant discharge waters.

Impact

- Failure to obtain the sample pyrolyzer will severely impact FDA's ability to monitor the influx of samples expected following the release of contaminated water from Fukushima holding tanks.
- Currently, WEAC can only analyze tritium as part of water molecules. Without the sample pyrolyzer, WEAC will not be able to provide accurate tritium analytical results for those samples that contain organically bound tritium.

Objectives

- To install an analytical furnace system optimized for the quantitative extraction of volatile radionuclides, such as tritium, from solid and liquid samples.

- To institute rapid and reproducible extraction capability for tritium analysis on regulatory samples.
- To implement the detection of both tritiated water and organically bound tritium for regulatory samples.

Scope

The requested pyrolyzer furnace system shall be an off-the-shelf product without the need for additional instrumentation. The installed pyrolyzer furnace system shall include all hardware, accessories, and software to enable the extraction of tritium from food.

Requirements

The contractor shall provide a pyrolyzer furnace system off-the-shelf product without the need for additional instrumentation. The contractor shall install pyrolyzer furnace system to include all hardware, accessories, and software to enable the extraction of tritium from food.

- The contractor shall ensure the following minimum salient specifications for the pyrolyzer furnace system: shall have 3 independent temperature-controlled furnace zones
- Shall have over temperature protection
- Shall be equipped with 6 independent sample work-tubes for a minimum 6 samples/day sample throughput
- Shall accept up to 10g (dry) sample per tube
- Shall have >95% bubbler trapping efficiencies for H³
- Shall be equipped with all necessary instrument control, calibration, and application software
- Shall operate with automatic gas switching
- Shall have a total weight less than 130 kg
- Shall have data logging with USB output
- Shall come with necessary accessories
- Shall have an overall space usage less than 330cm (L) X 70cm (W) X 100cm (H)
- Shall include onsite installation service
- Shall include basic training on instrument operation

The contractor shall ensure the following:

1. The components and/or equipment shall be a newly manufactured, not used and refurbished, or previously used for demonstration.
2. The entire system shall be warranted for parts and labor for a minimum of 1 year from date of formal government acceptance. The warranty must include unlimited telephone/e-mail support for questions regarding operation.
3. Offered systems shall be a turn-key solution, i.e. the contractor shall be responsible for providing all hardware, components, and software.
4. The systems shall be delivered with all necessary supplies and accessories required for installation, start-up and tritium extraction.
5. The contractor shall demonstrate upon installation that the system meets or exceeds all performance specifications which have been included in the vendor's response and/or used are evaluation criteria for award. The instrument shall not be accepted until those performance specifications have been met.

6. No subcontractors or other personnel not employed by the offeror shall be utilized for instrument service.
7. Onsite training on basic operations and familiarization of the instrument shall be provided at the time of installation.
 - The contractor shall demonstrate upon installation that the system meets or exceeds all performance specifications which have been included in the vendor's response and/or used are evaluation criteria for award.
 - The instrument shall not be accepted until those performance specifications have been met.
8. All service costs, i.e., software, labor, and travel, must be included.

The offeror or applicant shall submit all electronic documents for Microsoft Office suite products without the use of "macros". If the offeror or applicant submits documents that contain macros, macro referenced files, and/or executable files, the Government will not be able to view or open such documents and the submission will be considered non-responsive to the solicitation. No additional time will be given to an offeror or applicant to correct the document submission and the Government will not inform the offeror or applicant that their submission is non-responsive prior to award. Basis for Award/Evaluation Criteria

The Government shall award a firm fixed price contract resulting from this solicitation to the responsible Quoter using the lowest price, technically acceptable (LPTA) evaluation method. The Government intends to evaluate quotes and award an order without discussions. FDA will first evaluate all Offerors' prices, then, evaluate the apparent lowest-priced quote/proposal for technical acceptability. If the lowest-price Offeror was evaluated as unacceptable, FDA would then consider the acceptability of the next lowest-price Offeror, continuing this process as necessary. Quoters' initial quote should contain the Quoters' best terms from a price standpoint. FOR Equivalent requirements that differ from the minimum salient requirements the Quoter shall provide a technical narrative and supporting documentation to demonstrate that their quoted requirements meet the needs of the solicitation. The Government requests the Contractor to provide discounts off their established pricing for each line item. The Government reserves the right to conduct discussions if later determined by the Contracting Officer to be necessary.
