If this contract is completely or partially terminated, the records relating to the work terminated shall be made available for 3 years after any resulting final termination settlement. Records relating to appeals under the disputes clause or to litigation or the settlement of claims arising under or relating to this contract shall be made available until such appeals, litigation, or claims are finally resolved.

(3) As used in this clause, records include books, documents, accounting procedures and practices, and other data, regardless of type and regardless of form. This does not require the Contractor to create or maintain any record that the Contractor does not maintain in the ordinary course of business or pursuant to a provision of law.

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(a) *Definitions.* As used in this clause –

*Payment request* means a bill, voucher, invoice, or request for contract financing payment with associated supporting documentation. The payment request must comply with the requirements identified in FAR 32.905(b), “Content of Invoices” and the applicable Payment clause included in this contract.

(b) Except as provided in paragraph (c) of this clause, the Contractor shall submit payment requests electronically using the Department of Treasury Invoice Processing Platform (IPP) or successor system. I. Purpose

- a. The primary objective of this project is to install and provide plumbing as needed to (7) new eyewash station at the Dzilh-Na-O-Dith-Hle Health Center (DZHC). The departments that require an eyewash include Facility Maintenance, Janitor Closet/Housekeeping Rooms, Laboratory, Soiled Room, and Patient Cast Room.


### V. Miscellaneous

# EYE WASH STATION FLOOR PLAN


