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**Summary:**

The United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit (CAFC) is currently requesting quotations for the purchase and installation of new outdoor furniture for the judicial courtyard area in the **National Courts Building (NCB) at 717 Madison Place, Washington, DC 20439**.

This is a request for **pricing under the Knoll BPA**.

**Background:**

As one of only two Article III federal appellate courts with national jurisdiction, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit adjudicates appeals from federal trial courts and federal agencies around the country in a variety of subject areas, including patents and trademarks, international trade, monetary claims against the United States government, federal personnel decisions, veterans' benefits, and government contract disputes.

The swift and accurate resolution of these appeals provides surety and confidence to the private industry in inventing new pharmaceuticals or technological advancements, to importers and exporters of goods and products, to veterans seeking proper medical benefits, and to people entitled to compensation when wronged by the United States government.
