Palletized Items

For **ALL** items delivered on pallets, the item must be kept on the pallet until ready to set into final placement. Using your offloading equipment, set pallet where the item will ultimately be placed. Lift the item with offloading equipment, remove pallet, and set item down. **DO NOT** lift item with equipment and travel to location of placement. This will damage the item and Outdoor Creations Inc. will **NOT** be liable for damage associated with improper product handling.

Picnic Tables:

NOTE: Nylon slings may be used around table top to maneuver the table (call for instructions).

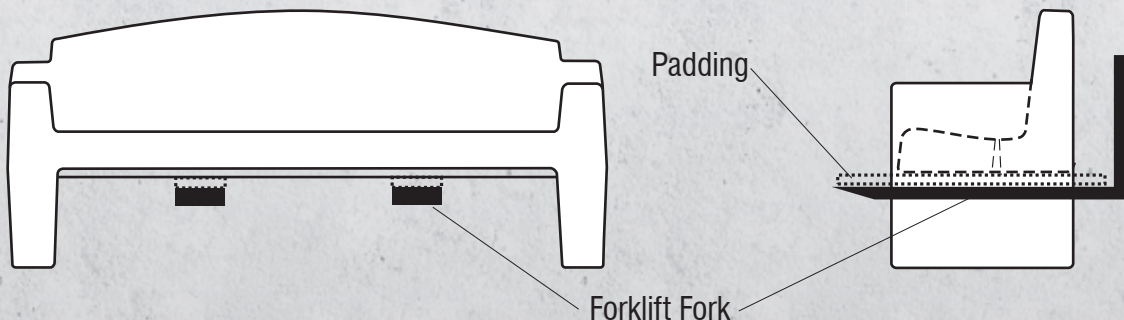

Benches:

Lift bench with well padded forklift forks (carpet, cardboard, wood, etc) from front or back staying as centered as possible for good load balance. Keep forks spread as far as possible for lateral balance. Keep bench absolutely level to the ground when lifting or setting to eliminate risk of chipping leg bottoms.

Family Barbecues & Hot Coal Receptacles:

Lift grills to reveal chain hook notches located on (2) opposing corners of lower grill. See figure 1 and 2.

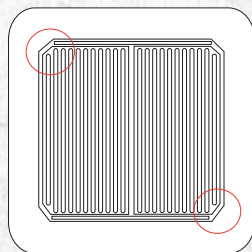
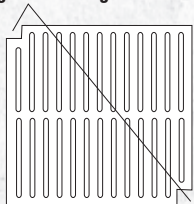


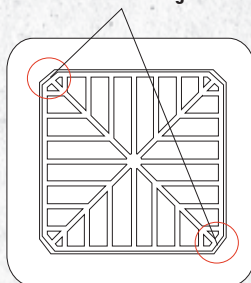

Lift points on a Hot Coal Receptacle are the opposing corners of the grill

Attach hook equipped ends of suitable chain, cable, strap, etc to two opposing chain notches on lower grill.

Use suitable equipment (ie. Forklift, crane, front loader, etc) to lift barbecue.

***When removing barbecue from pallet for placement, place palletized item in final position to minimize travel time while hanging.**

Group Barbecues:

Lift center hotplates to reveal hook notches cut into vertical grill frame below hotplates. See notch location, figure 1 and 2.

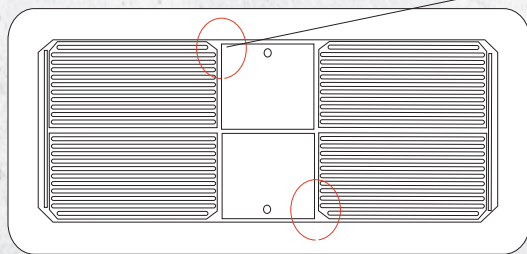
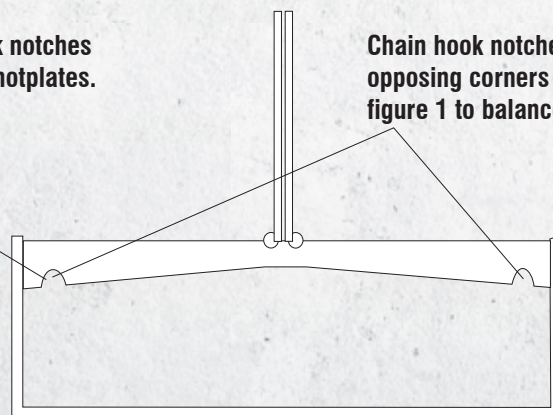


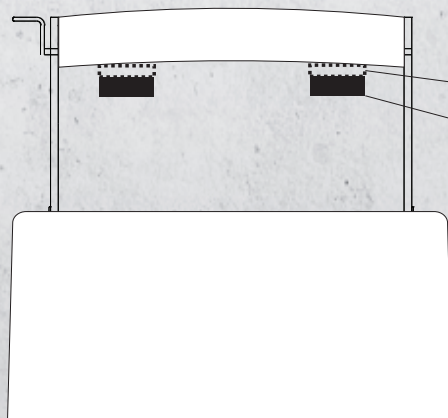

Chain hook notches, use from opposing corners as shown in figure 1 to balance weight.

Attach hook equipped ends of suitable chain, cable, strap, etc to two opposing chain notches on grill frame. Use suitable equipment (ie. forklift, crane, front loader, etc) to lift barbecue.

For adjustable grill group barbecues (#3001AG), forklift forks can be placed under arch and lifted off of pallet.

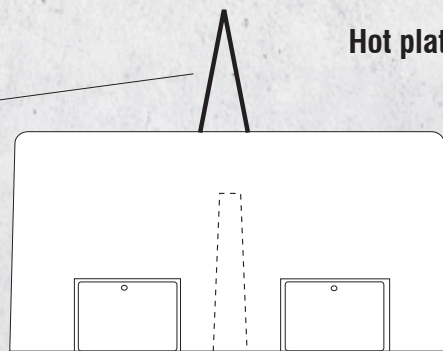

IMPORTANT NOTICE:

The grills that come with barbecues and firepits have a coating on them. Before the first use, it is important to heat the grill up to a proper temperature to burn the coating off. Once the coating has been burned off, lightly coat the surface of the grill with a vegetable oil. The grill can be maintained by periodically repeating the "seasoning" process of heating the grill and lightly coating with vegetable oil.

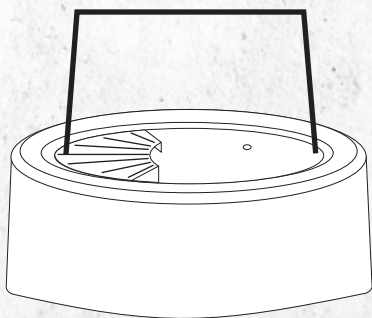

Firepits:



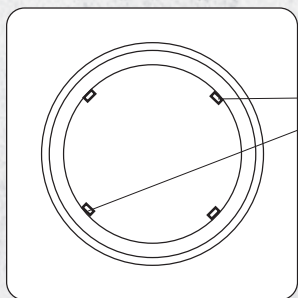
Lifting chains need to attach vertically so that weight is supported at as close to 90 degree angle from lifting point as possible.

ONLY LIFT FROM OUTER MOST POINT OF GRILL AS SHOWN.

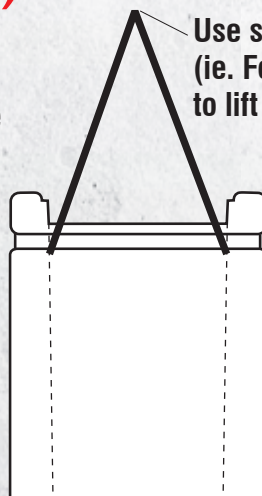
Allowing lift point to occur at inside of grill will damage grill.

Waste Receptacles (with top metal lid):

Lift lid from waste receptacle to reveal (4) cast in threaded inserts containing bag retaining hooks. Remove liner if so equipped. Remove two opposing bolts and attach chain or other lifting device with $\frac{1}{2}$ " X $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " coarse thread bolts.



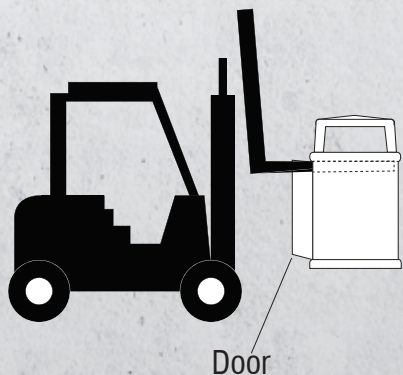
Threaded inserts,

Waste Receptacles (Model# 507, 508, 509, 512, 513, 517):



Door

Trash receptacle unit ***CANNOT*** be lifted by top.

DO NOT TRANSPORT UNIT IN THIS MANNER AS DAMAGE COULD OCCUR.

Pre-place unit in final location by pallet. Insert padded forklift fork through door, lift off of pallet, remove pallet and set receptacle in place.

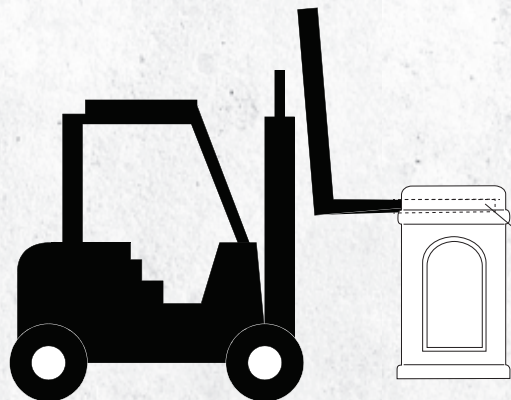

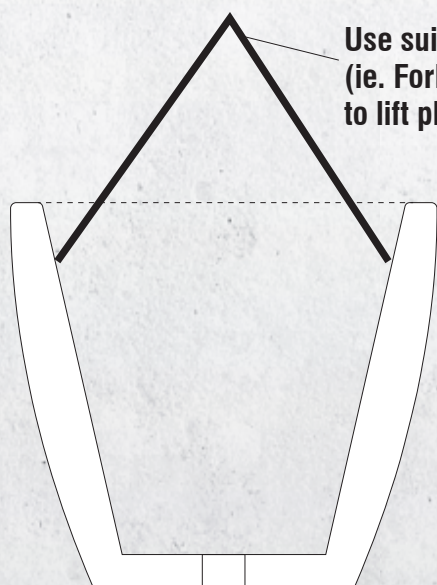
Waste Receptacles w/rounded tops (Model# 504, 506):



Pre-place unit in final location by pallet. Insert padded forklift fork between opening and door, lift off of pallet, remove pallet and set receptacle in place.

Forks with padding

Planters:



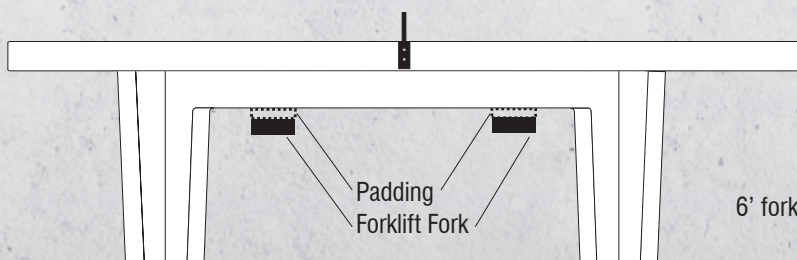
Use suitable equipment (ie. Forklift, crane, front loader, etc) to lift planter.

Remove two opposing bolts and attach chain or other lifting device with $\frac{1}{2}$ " X $1\frac{1}{2}$ " coarse thread bolts.

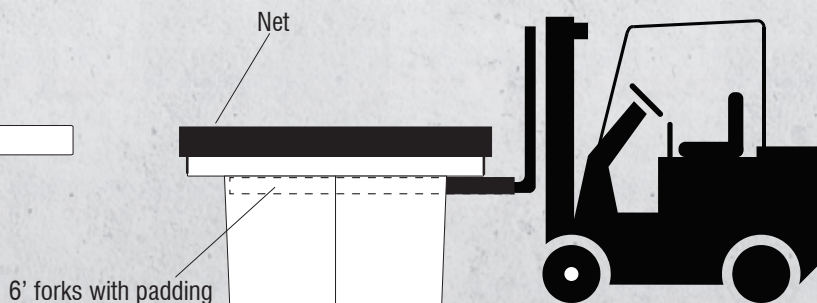
*When removing planter from pallet for placement, place palletized item in final position to minimize travel time while hanging.

Table Tennis Tables:

*Minimum 8,000 lb. lift required.
