1. This guideline is to be utilized by SF personnel vetting individuals requesting unabated installation access. The Commander indicated in the parentheses below "Deny" is the minimum authority necessary to override a denial of unabated installation access as determined by this matrix.

2. This matrix does not list all instances which may disqualify an individual from being granted unabated installation access. A measure of discretion is expected of SF personnel conducting vetting activities, and the SFS Plans and Programs NCOIC reviewing/approving said activities.

3. An inability to identify proof (positively identify) an individual is automatic grounds to deny unabated installation access. Furthermore, any attempts to obfuscate a criminal history or background may also be grounds for denial of unabated installation access.
