

# **COMBINED SYNOPSIS/SOLICITATION**

## **Compressed Gas Supply**

This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial items prepared in accordance with the format in the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Subpart 12.6, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; proposals are being requested and a written solicitation will not be issued.

The combined synopsis/solicitation number is W912D0-23-R-0002 and is issued as a Request for Quotation (RFQ) to establish a Firm Fixed Price (FFP) supply Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA) for the purchase of Compressed Gasses at Fort Wainwright, Fort Greely and JBER Alaska.

The combined synopsis/solicitation document and incorporated provisions and clauses are those in effect through Federal Acquisition Circular (FAC) 2022-04, effective 30 January 2022. The DFARS provisions and clauses are those in effect 18 March 2022.

This requirement is a Full and Open to maximize competition

The associated North American Industrial Classification System (NAICS) code for this procurement is 325120 Industrial Gas Manufacturing. The NAICS Code was identified through a review of the U.S. Census Bureau's website where Industrial Gas Manufacturing was listed as a corresponding index category. The small business size standard is 1000 employees.

### **DESCRIPTION OF REQUIREMENT:**

- a. Vendor must provide all gas cylinders within the scope of the contract and up to the dollar amount agreed upon. Additional compressed gases may be added at the discretion of the contracting officer after negotiating pricing with the vendor. All gases and cylinder actions listed on the vendors quote will remain available to the Government unless removed through the discussion of both parties.
- b. Vendor must deliver cylinders to units within Fort Wainwright and Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson (JBER) as indicated on the Calls. Fort Greely will transport their cylinders to be filled as needed.
- c. This Blanket Purchase Agreement will cover 5 years or a cumulative value of \$450K whichever is reached first. A Contracting Officer will review and approve the price list as negotiated. Any proposed change to pricing by the vendor must be approved prior to any deliveries at those prices. The price list will be an attachment to the Blanket Purchase Agreement.
- d. The vendor will inspect and fill government provided gas cylinders on an as needed basis.
- e. Upon delivery, the Contractor shall provide each unit with documentation stating the types of compressed gases delivered, the quantities of each, and a listing of the number and types of cylinders picked up from the unit.

**PLACE OF PERFORMANCE:**

The place of performance shall be at Fort Wainwright, Fort Greely, and JBER Alaska.

**PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE:**

The period of performance (POP) shall be as follows: March 2023 to March 2028

Proposals shall be submitted electronically and no other method of proposal submission will be accepted. Adobe (.pdf), Microsoft Word (.doc) and Microsoft Excel (.xlsx) are acceptable formats for submitting proposals.

**BASIS OF CONTRACT AWARD:**

The Government intends to award a Firm-Fixed Price supply BPA to a responsible vendor capable of meeting the requirements of the listed purchase description and to whom proposal conforms to the combined synopsis/solicitation.

Vendors are required to be registered in the System for Award Management (SAM) at the time a proposal is submitted. Vendors can register at <https://www.sam.gov>.

Only vendors who are registered in SAM under NAICS 325120 Industrial Gas Manufacturing, have no active exclusions, and have completed and updated their FAR & DFARS Representations and Certifications will be considered.

Vendors shall ensure the update of SAM records and FAR & DFARS Representations and Certifications.

Vendor must provide Section 889 representations, Part A and B, within their representations and certifications. OCT 2020 or later versions for FAR 52.204-24, 52.204-26 and 52.212-3 are now available in SAM. Ensure the update of SAM records and provide representations within the OCT 2020 or later provisions.

The submission of invoices shall be in accordance with FAR clause 52.212-4(g). The contractor shall submit ALL invoices electronically utilizing Wide Area Work Flow (WAWF). Procedures for using WAWF are found in DFARS clause 252-232-7003, Electronic Submission of Payment Requests and Receiving Reports.

A summary invoice shall be submitted at least monthly or upon expiration, whichever occurs first, for all supplies provided during a monthly billing period and for which payment has not been received. A summary invoice shall be submitted at least monthly or upon expiration of this BPA, whichever occurs first, for all deliveries made during a billing period and for which payment has not been received. This individual invoices need not be supported by copies of delivery tickets.

As prescribed in [4.2105\(a\)](#), insert the following provision:

REPRESENTATION REGARDING CERTAIN TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND VIDEO SURVEILLANCE  
SERVICES OR EQUIPMENT (NOV 2021)

The Offeror shall not complete the representation at paragraph (d)(1) of this provision if the Offeror has represented that it "does not provide covered telecommunications

equipment or services as a part of its offered products or services to the Government in the performance of any contract , subcontract , or other contractual instrument" in paragraph (c)(1) in the provision at [52.204-26](#), Covered Telecommunications Equipment or Services —Representation, or in paragraph (v)(2)(i) of the provision at [52.212-3](#), Offeror Representations and Certifications-Commercial Products or Commercial Services. The Offeror shall not complete the representation in paragraph (d)(2) of this provision if the Offeror has represented that it "does not use covered telecommunications equipment or services , or any equipment , system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services " in paragraph (c)(2) of the provision at [52.204-26](#), or in paragraph (v)(2)(ii) of the provision at [52.212-3](#).

(a) *Definitions.* As used in this provision—

*Backhaul , covered telecommunications equipment or services , critical technology , interconnection arrangements , reasonable inquiry , roaming , and substantial or essential component* have the meanings provided in the clause [52.204-25](#), Prohibition on Contracting for Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services or Equipment .

L. 115-232) prohibits the head of an executive agency on or after August 13, 2020, from entering into a contract or extending or renewing a contract with an entity that uses any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. This prohibition applies to the use of covered telecommunications equipment or services, regardless of whether that use is in performance of work under a Federal contract. Nothing in the prohibition shall be construed to—

(d) *Representation.* The Offeror represents that—

(A) The entity that produced the covered telecommunications equipment (include entity name, unique entity identifier, CAGE code, and whether the entity was the original equipment manufacturer (OEM) or a distributor, if known);

(B) A description of all covered telecommunications equipment offered (include brand; model number, such as OEM number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number; and item description, as applicable); and

(C) Explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications equipment and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b)(1) of this provision.

(ii) For covered services—

(A) If the service is related to item maintenance: A description of all covered telecommunications services offered (include on the item being maintained: Brand; model number, such as OEM number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number; and item description, as applicable); or

(B) If not associated with maintenance, the Product Service Code (PSC) of the service being provided; and explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications services and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b)(1) of this provision.

(2) Disclosure for the representation in paragraph (d)(2) of this provision. If the Offeror has responded "does" in the representation in paragraph (d)(2) of this provision, the Offeror shall provide the following information as part of the offer:

(i) For covered equipment —

(A) The entity that produced the covered telecommunications equipment (include entity name, unique entity identifier, CAGE code, and whether the entity was the OEM or a distributor, if known);

(B) A description of all covered telecommunications equipment offered (include brand; model number, such as OEM number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number; and item description, as applicable); and

(C) Explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications equipment and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b)(2) of this provision.

(ii) For covered services—

(A) If the service is related to item maintenance: A description of all covered telecommunications services offered (include on the item being maintained: Brand; model number, such as OEM number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number; and item description, as applicable); or

(B) If not associated with maintenance, the PSC of the service being provided; and explanation of the proposed use of covered telecommunications services and any factors relevant to determining if such use would be permissible under the prohibition in paragraph (b)(2) of this provision.
