(vi) Description of Requirement (including a list of any attachments)

The Forest Service is looking to upgrade Dorena Genetic Resource Center buildings monitoring system by installing a nonproprietary modern alarm system which can be monitored by any company that provides monitoring services and has an ACTIVE status in SAM.gov.

Equipment Installation (Line Item 0001)

The Dorena Genetic Resource Center is looking to upgrade the current building monitoring system. Dorena Genetic Resource Center currently has two proprietary panels for audio intrusion monitoring, managed access, and fire monitoring for five (5) buildings. The Government wishes to combine these two systems by upgrading to one new non-proprietary panel with "remote panels" in designated buildings.

The site has extremely poor cell service and therefore communication with the new panel will be accomplished through the existing network for primary communication and Plain Old Telephone (POT) landlines for backup.

Currently there are network switches located in the Main Office (Building No. 2019), Seed Plant (2108), and the Inoculation Chamber building (2105). The contractor will install new remote security panels in each of these buildings and connect them to the existing network switches to allow the central panel to monitor the field devices. Contractor shall make all effort to retain the use of all existing field devices, including, but not limited to: door contacts, motion sensors, audio sensors, card readers, electric door strikes, and power supplies for access control but may replace if necessary. Contractor must notify the Contracting Officer Representative COR or Contracting Officer prior to replacing devices. The five buildings Main Office (2019), Seed Plant (2108), Inoculation Chamber building (2105), Water Treatment Plant (2636), and Shop (2220) will be separate zones on the system.

Additionally, the Government has a recently installed Firelite ES50X fire panel that communicates via the existing proprietary panels. Under this contract the fire, trouble, and supervisory alarms will continue to communicate via the main panel using IP for primary communication and a POT landline for backup. Contractor shall install a separate keypad for fire and mount this keypad next to existing fire panel.

Note on product substitutions: The existing system is heavily integrated with proprietary products. It is the goal of the government to install nonproprietary modern alarm system which can be monitored by any business providing security monitor services.

For clarity, brand names and model numbers for these devices and their modern replacements are used in this solicitation. In all cases, unless proprietary needs prevent product competition or substitution with alternate products would otherwise compromise system functionality, it should be considered that any products listed in this solicitation can be replaced with an "or equal." Alternate products that meet, or exceed, the intent of this solicitation will be considered.

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Zone A – Seed Plant (Building 2108):

- The monitoring panel (FlexIP, or equal) will be located in the IT room in the Seed Plant (Building 2108).
- The monitoring panel will be housed in a 27" enclosure provided by the Contractor; allow room to accommodate other devices and/or future expansion (access kit, power hub, backup battery, etc.).
- Three (3) existing access doors in the Seed Plant will tie into the new module.
- Power hub in main enclosure will connect all devices to LAN port and existing network to communicate to remote panels/devices in the field.
- Two (2) new keypads will replace old keypads at Front Entry door and Break Room door.
- One Winland EnviroAlert EA400 (or equal) will be installed to monitor temperature for a new freezer in the Seed Plant.
- Run CAT5 wire for each new keypad to Front Entry door and Break Room door from the IT room where main panel will be located.
- Run 6 conductor 22 AWG shielded plenum wire to the new EnviroAlert unit for power and zone monitoring.

Zone B – Main Office (Building 2019):

- "Remote panel" which will consist of two (2) Audio 8 (or equal) modules and two (2) Access 4 Pro (or equal) modules will be located in IT room where old enclosures are located. Modules will be housed in a 27" enclosure.
- Access 4 Pro (or equal) modules will accommodate existing access control doors in the Main Office.
- Audio 8 (or equal) modules will accommodate existing alarm points and audio sensors. Each module shall support 8 Audio Sensors and 8 hard-wired alarm devices.
- Two (2) Power Hubs (or equal) will connect all devices to LAN port and into existing network port for communication to the FlexIP (or equal) panel.
- Two (2) new keypads will replace old keypads located at Front Entry and Rear Entry doors.
- Run CAT 6 from each keypad location to the IT room in Main Office.

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Zone C – Shop (Building 2220):

- Shop will have one (1) new keypad to replace old and is connected to the panel in the Seed Plant.
- Shop has one (1) existing access door also connected to Access 4 Pro module in Seed Plant.
- Run CAT 6 from keypad location to the IT room in Seed Plant.

Zone D – Chamber Building (Building 2105):

- "Remote panel" which will consist of one (1) Audio 8 (or equal) module and one (1) Access 4 Pro (or equal) module will be located in restroom where old enclosures are located. Modules will be housed in a 27" enclosure.
- There is a network switch next to the panel which will provide LAN connection to the FlexIP (or equal) in the Seed Plant.
- Power Hub (or equal) will provide power and LAN connection to the existing devices and switch.
- Access 4 Pro (or equal) module will accommodate two (2) existing access doors.
- Audio 8 (or equal) module will accommodate existing audio sensors and hard-wired intrusion devices.
- Contractor will add two (2) additional Audio Sensors: one in the Entry area and one in the Warehouse. Wire run for audio sensors will be performed by contractor.
- Run CAT 6 from keypad location at entry door to remote panel location in restroom.

Zone E – Water Treatment Plant (Building 2636):

- Replace old keypad by entry door and connect to remote panel in Inoculation Chamber Building.
- Run CAT 6 from Entry door to the remote panel near the Restroom in the Rooting Chamber Building.

Additional items included in Base Installation:

- Provide electrician for any work outside of low-voltage work, including, but not limited to, adding power outlets near equipment, or running hardwire line voltage circuits to devices. **Notify COR or CO before work is started.**

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System Functionality: in addition to the characteristics described above, system shall be able to:

- Final installed system to provide 24 hour per day remote monitoring of access control, sensors, and alarm system.
- System supplier must be capable of providing a premium self-service account management feature that includes the Government's ability to independently customize front gate access schedule and controls.
- Provide an interface, preferably internet based, for the maintenance of an authorized personnel list, and the addition and removal of personnel to and from that list. Keycards shall be uniquely identified when swiped and the system shall have the ability to retain a record of access logs for at least a 30-day period.
- Access control for the gate will be integrated into monitoring system which provides for occasional schedule changes due to holidays, inclement weather closures, and times of heightened security.

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Option Item 0002 Fire Alarm Upgrades

Dorena Genetic Resource Center currently has fire detection devices in the Inoculation Chamber (Building 2105) and Water Treatment Plant (Building 2636) connected to an old proprietary panel. This Option Item, if exercised, would include adding new fire detection devices to the Inoculation Chamber and Water Treatment Plant buildings to connect to the Fire Alarm Control Panel (FACP) in the Main Office/Seed Plant and provide full integration with the equipment installed under the Base Installation Line Item.

Work under this item includes:

- Contractor will run cables underground in existing conduit from Main Office IT Room where there is an existing power supply with an open output to run Notification Appliance Circuit (NAC) to Chamber & Water Treatment buildings.
- Contractor shall tie in to existing MM300 Module for Signal Line Circuits (SLC) to Smokes, Heats, and Manual Pull Stations (MPS) in the Chambers and Water Treatment buildings.
- Wire run from Main Office to Chamber is approximately 500 feet (estimated, contractor to field verify); from Chamber to Water Treatment is approximately 150 feet (estimated, contractor to field verify).
- Contractor shall place a Power Supply in the Chamber building to provide power to the NACs in the Chamber & Water Treatment buildings.
- Contractor shall provide electrician to provide power to the new power supply in the Inoculation Chamber building.
- All panels and surge protection devices shall be grounded per NEC requirements.
- Installer shall provide battery backup calculations for the new system and place the documentation for the battery backup with manuals and other system information

Additional items included in Base Installation:

- Provide electrician for any work outside of low-voltage work, including, but not limited to, adding power outlets near equipment, or running hardwire line voltage circuits to devices

For one calendar year following the acceptance of work installed under the Base Installation Fee (Line Item 0001) and Option Item 0002 and 0003 (if awarded), all repairs shall be completed at no additional cost to the government.
