## **STATEMENT OF WORK**

### **1.01 SUMMARY OF WORK TO BE DONE BY CONTRACTOR**

- A. Furnish and install a sewer service line as shown on the drawings.
- B. Abandon existing sewer system.

### **1.02 SITE LOCATION**

8166 158 Road  
Mayetta, Kansas 66509

### **1.03 CONSTRUCTION SCHEDULE**

- A. Contact the Engineering Technician three business days before the start of any work.
- B. Failure to perform work on the date scheduled will require rescheduling the work 24-hours in advance.
- C. Leave all work exposed until it is inspected and approved. Work not inspected before it is covered shall be re-exposed at the Contractor's expense.

### **1.04 QUALITY ASSURANCE**

- A. Perform work under the direction of personnel licensed in the state including, Kansas licensed Plumbing.

### **1.05 WARRANTY**

- A. Provide a minimum one-year warranty for all materials and labor, covering defects in the materials or workmanship.

### **1.06 MATERIALS**

- A. Pipe, fittings and cleanouts:
  - 1. Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) pipe, fittings and cleanouts shall be PVC schedule 40 in amounts as specified in the bid schedule.
  - 2. Bell ended joints conforming to ASTM D 3212
  - 3. Four (4) inch nominal diameter and longest pipe length available for gravity wastewater pipe.
- B. Pipe Casement:
  - 1. Polyvinyl Chloride (PVC) pipe, shall be Schedule 40 in amounts as specified in bid schedule.
  - 2. Bell ended joints conforming to ASTM D 3212.
  - 3. Eight (8) inch nominal diameter and longest pipe length available for piping under highway and water main.
- C. Septic tank:

1. Septic tank capacity shall be a 1,000-gallon tank with effluent filter assembly and filter with lift handle.
  2. Access holes in tank lid shall be a minimum diameter of 20 inches for access to inlet sanitary Tee and effluent filter (outlet end of tank).
  3. Access risers and lids shall be installed for access to inlet sanitary Tee and effluent filter.
  4. Inlet and outlet piping; 4 inch schedule 40 PVC.
- D. Effluent Assembly
1. Polylok PL-68 Effluent Filter or approved equivalent.
  2. ¾" PVC lift handle
- E. Concrete adapter ring, access risers and covers.
1. Concrete tank adapter ring will be of solid design and prevent movement of soil around the riser. Arc3009 Polylok, 24 inch, or approved equal.
  2. Riser will be a solid, double-walled polyethylene pipe with gasketed connections. Twenty four (24") inch N-12 by ADS Pipe, or approved equal.
  3. Cover will completely cover riser so to prevent gases from leaking out and be of solid construction. Covers to be Polylok 3008-West, 24-inch HDPE flat septic tank cover or approved equal.
  4. Joint sealant to be applied between the riser and adapter and the adapter and tank. Sealant to be a bitumous plastic joint sealant. Ram-Nek RN 103, or approved equal.
- F. Turf and Grasses (Fertilizer, Seed and Mulch):
1. Fertilizer: 20-10-10 mixture of 20% nitrogen, 10% Phosphorous, and 10% Pot Ash.
  2. Seed Mixture: Blend of Kentucky 31, Fescue, and annual rye grass.
  3. Mulch: Prairie (native) hay, not more than 2 years old and free of noxious weeds.

## 1.07 INSTALLATION

- A. Septic Tank Installation:
1. Place tank in excavations at locations and elevations designated on the drawings or by Engineering Technician.
  2. Excavation for tanks shall be 24 inches larger than the dimensions of the tank and 4 inches deeper to compensate for 4 inches of bedding.
  3. Remove any water from excavation and check grade before setting tank.
  4. Place 4 inches of crushed rock or sand for bedding of septic tank.
  5. Fill with potable water before backfilling.
  6. Place tank level.
  7. Install inlet Tee and effluent filter assembly in septic tank.
    - a. Extend inlet Tee to a depth of 14 to 16 inches below inlet invert of septic tank.
    - b. Install the effluent filter assembly to replace the outlet sanitary Tee.
    - c. The bottom of the outlet invert shall be at least 3 inches lower than the bottom of the inlet invert.
  8. Connect riser adapter ring to top of septic tank with corrosion resistant fasteners and seal to tank with RN 103 Ram-Nek joint sealant or approved equal.

9. Connect riser to adapter ring with stainless steel screws and seal with RN 103 Ram-Nek joint sealant or approved equal.
  - a. Rise and cover shall terminate at approximately 2 inches above finish grade.
- B. Sewer Lines Installation:
  1. Furnish and install sewer lines at locations on the drawings or as directed by the Engineering Technician.
  2. Connection to existing sewers: 4" Schedule 40 PVC pipe connected to existing sewer pipe within 5ft of foundation of home.
  3. No pipe joints shall be made within 2 feet of inlet or outlet of septic tank or edge of tank excavation.
  4. Minimum slope for sewer lines is 1/8 inch per foot (1%).
  5. Ninety-degree bends are not allowed between home and septic tank.
- C. Sewer Line Casement
  1. Install casement as indicated on drawings.
  2. Ends and joints of casement shall be located a minimum of 10 feet horizontally from water main line crossings
  3. Sewer service line shall be properly supported throughout casement using 2"x 4" wood skids or approved equal.
  4. Seal ends of casement with concrete, grout, or flex couplings.
- D. Existing Septic Tank Abandonment:
  1. Abandon septic tank in-place by excavating to top of existing tank and pumping all contents of tank.
  2. Break bottom and sides of tank so it will not hold water.
  3. Collapse tank lid inside of tank so that pieces of the lid will not cause large voids
  4. Backfill and compact with soil exposing existing septic tank and excavated remaining soil from the installation of the new septic tank.
  5. Solvent weld a cap similar to existing pipe leading to lagoon.
- E. Abandonment of Wastewater Lagoon:
  1. Solvent weld a cap similar to existing pipe going into lagoon.
  2. Contact Prairie Band Potawatomi Environmental Protection Agency for locations and methods to dispose lagoon water.

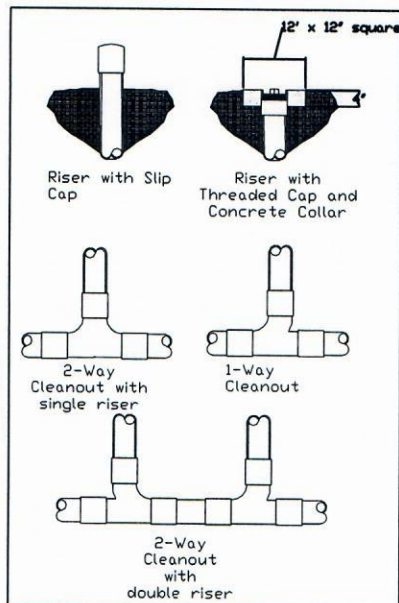
3. Fencing, trees and brush may be utilized to fill in lagoon prior to pushing in lagoon berms so that area will not have standing water.
- F. Turf and Grasses (Fertilizer, Seed and Mulch): All areas disturbed by construction work.
1. Fertilizing:
    - a. Apply using mechanical equipment.
    - b. Uniformly distribute.
    - c. Incorporate into soil using harrow or other suitable equipment.
    - d. Conform to recommendations of local county extension agent.
    - e. Fertilize the area at an application rate of 200 pounds per acre.
  2. Seeding:
    - a. Sow seed using either equipment suited to that purpose or scatter seed uniformly over area with hand seeders when the weather is sufficiently quiet to prevent seeds from blowing away.
    - b. Plant when soil temperature is 60° F or greater.
    - c. Application rate
      - 1) 200 pounds per acre of the Kentucky 31, fescue, and rye grass.
    - d. Lightly rake soil to cover the seed with approximately ¼ inch of soil.
  3. Mulching:
    - a. Place hay mulching on seeded area loose enough to allow some sunlight to penetrate and air to circulate but thick enough to shade the ground, conserve soil moisture, and prevent/reduce erosion.
    - b. Do not perform mulching activities during periods of excessively high winds, which would preclude the proper placing of the mulch.
    - c. Apply straw or hay uniformly over the disturbed area to a loose depth of ½ to 1½ inches using 2 to 2 ½ tons of mulch per acre.
    - d. Immediately after spreading, anchor mulch using a mulch tiller consisting of a series of dull flat discs with notched edges or other approved equipment.
- G. Watering
1. Follow seed supplier's recommendations.
  2. Initial watering will be done by contractor.

## **1.08 TESTING**

- A. Visually inspect each pipe joint for to verify all pipe joints have been primed and glued.
- B. Solvent weld all joints that do not appear to be primed and glued.

## **1.09 SITE RESTORATION**

- A. Restore site to as close to the original condition.
- B. Provide Record Drawings to the Project Engineer.

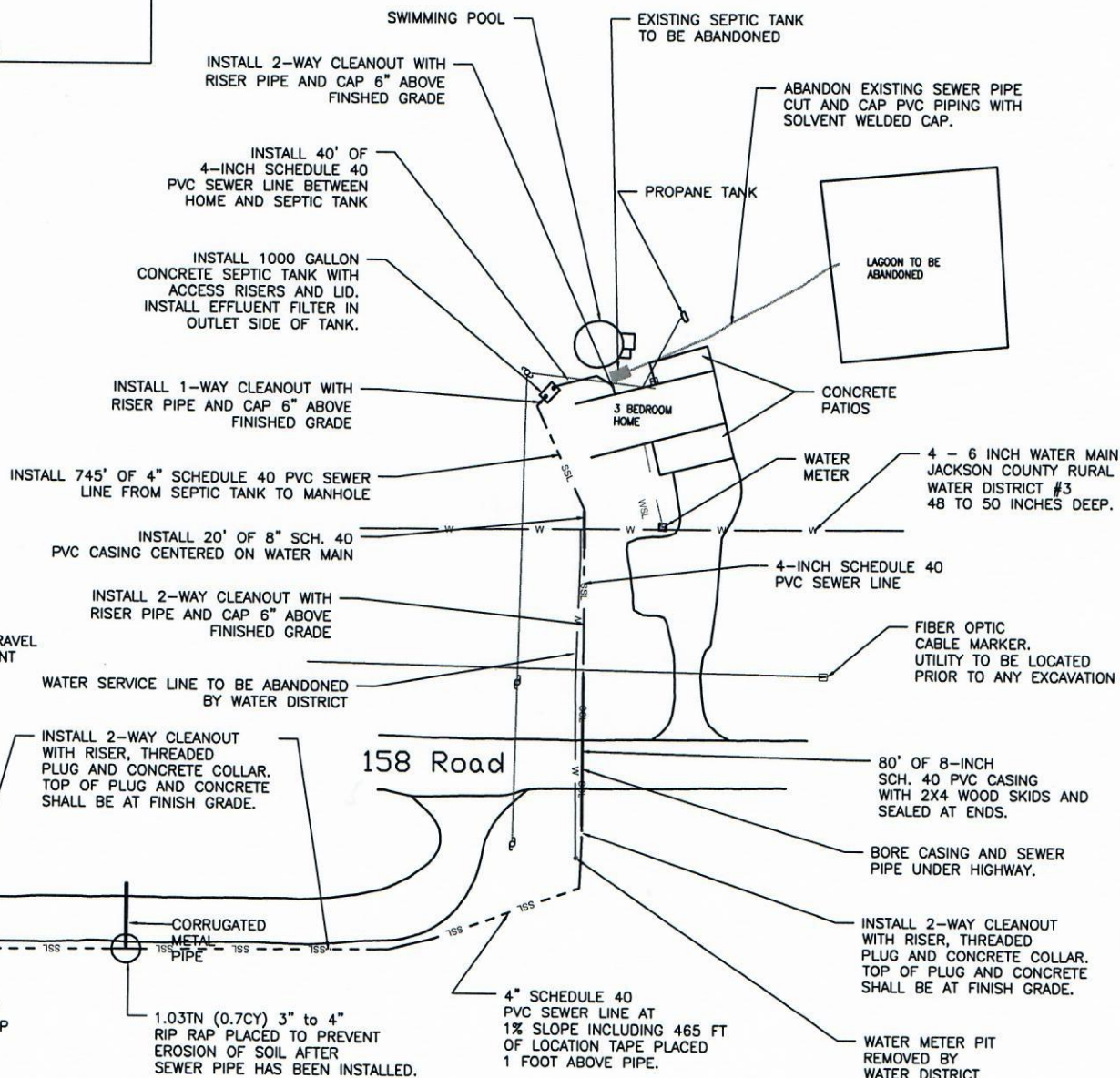

- \* INSTALL NEW 1,000 GALLON SEPTIC TANK WITH EFFLUENT FILTER ASSEMBLY WITH FILTER AND LIFT HANDLE, INCLUDING ACCESS RISERS, LIDS AND APPURTENANCES.
- \* INSTALL 20' OF 8" SCHEDULE 40 PVC PIPE AS CASING FOR 4" SEWER PIPE TO CROSS WATER MAIN INCLUDING INSTALLING PIPE SKIDS. ENDS OF CASING ARE TO BE SEALED.
- \* INSTALL 80' OF 8" SCHEDULE 40 PVC PIPE AS CASING FOR 4" SEWER PIPE TO CROSS UNDER HIGHWAY INCLUDING PIPE SKIDS. ENDS OF CASING ARE TO BE SEALED.
- \* INSTALL 465' OF SEWER LOCATION TAPE TO BE PLACE 1FT ABOVE 4" PIPE FROM CLEANOUT AT END OF HIGHWAY CASEMENT TO SEWER MAIN.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

#### Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

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#### WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- \* an existing published wage determination
- \* a survey underlying a wage determination
- \* a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- \* a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour National Office because National Office has responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator

(See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
