1. The competition will have over 250 cadre and competitors. The services requested will allow Soldiers in the field to relieve themselves and wash/sanitize their hands afterwards.

1.1. Description of Services/Introduction: Womack Army Medical Center, Fort Bragg NC will host the fiscal year 2023 Medical Readiness Command – East (MRC-E), Best Leader Competition (BLC) FROM April 2 thru 21, 2023 on Fort Bragg, NC. Medical Readiness Command – East (MRC-E), is the anchor for this year's competition, which was formerly known as Best Squad Competition. The BLC is designed to promote "Esprit De Corps" throughout the Army while recognizing Soldiers who demonstrate commitment to the Army values and embody the Warrior Ethos. **2.0 Quality Assurance:** The COR will evaluate the Contractor's performance under this contract in accordance with the Quality Assurance Surveillance Plan (QASP). This plan is primarily focused on what the COR must do to ensure that the Contractor has performed in accordance with the performance standards. It defines how the performance standards will be applied, the frequency of surveillance, and the minimum acceptable defect rate(s). When an observation indicates defective performance, the COR will require the Contractor or designated on-site representative to initial the observation to acknowledge the defective performance. The acknowledgement of the observation does not necessarily constitute Contractor concurrence with the observation, only that the Contractor has been made aware of the defective performance
