

Combined Synopsis/Solicitation: 140D0423Q0689 - Amendment 2

The purpose of this amendment is to change Contracting Officer and Contract Specialist, answer contractor questions, update Line Items, and extend the due date. These changes are highlighted in yellow with in the following combined synopsis/solicitation.

Areas highlighted in blue shall be completed/submitted by the offeror. Failure to complete areas highlighted in blue may result in an offer not being considered for award.

This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial products or commercial services prepared in accordance with the format in Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Subpart 12.6, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. This announcement constitutes the only solicitation; quotes are being requested. The solicitation document and incorporated provisions and clauses are those in effect through the FAR and the Health and Human Services Acquisition Regulation (HHSAR). This solicitation is being issued as a Request for Quotation (RFQ) in accordance with FAR Parts 12 and 13 and the resulting purchase order will be Firm Fixed Price (FFP).

This RFQ is a Full and Open competition in accordance under NAICS code 334510-Patient Monitoring Equipment with a small business size standard of 1,250 employees.

Offerors are required to have an active SAM Registration. SAM registration enables electronic funds transfer of contract payments. If your company is not already actively registered, please register in the SAM database at www.sam.gov. If your company is currently registered and close to expiring, begin/complete the process for SAM registration renewal. A SAM Unique Entity ID (UEI) is required for SAM registration. If your company does not have a UEI one can be obtained at www.sam.gov.

Whether your company is a current or new registrant in the SAM database, your registration must indicate that you are a provider of NAICS 334510, or a NAICS of similar business size, under the Goods – Services section of the registration to be eligible to receive a contract for this solicitation.

If the prospective awardee for this request for quotes is not actively registered in the SAM database by close of solicitation, including NAICS 334510, or a NAICS of similar business size, under the Goods – Services section, the government reserves the right to proceed to award to the next otherwise successful offeror.

The following is the description of requirements for the items to be acquired. The items to be acquired shall be brand name or equal to the model/part numbers identified. To be considered for award, offers of "equal" products, including "equal" products of the brand name manufacturer, must meet the salient characteristics specified below.

The Fetal Monitor Carts requested will be housing the hospital owned GE Fetal Monitor Corometrics 250CX, desktop (Dell Optiplex 7090 Micro), two monitors, and an uninterrupted power supply.

The Fetal Monitoring Cart shall be compatible with GE Fetal Monitor Corometrics 250CX system and include the following features:

- Color: Light Maple for non-metal services
- Minimum of 3 drawers
- Must be able to support two monitors side by side (22 inch and 26 inch)
- 4 Locking Base Casters
- GCX channel profile
- Work surface
- Patient lead organizer

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS AMENDMENT 0002:

Question 1. Onsite Installation and Configuration is listed on the solicitation however the fetal carts come fully assembled with the exception of the hospital's monitors that they already have there. Usually the hospital IT can mount the monitor on the cart. Will this be a concern?

Answer 1. If the cart comes fully assembled, only the configuration of cart, customers devices and cables is required.

Question 2. In your specs it does not specify whether the keyboard tray should be height adjustable, or a standard pull out tray for the keyboard. What color should the finished color be?

Answer 2. The keyboard is not required to be height adjustable. The color is light maple for surfaces that are not metal.

- 1) Technical Capability: The government will evaluate the offeror's technical information to determine if it is technically acceptable. Technically acceptable is defined as the offeror's ability to meet all the technical requirements identified in the solicitation.
- 2) Price: The government will evaluate the offeror's price for award purposes by adding the extended price for all Line Items. The Government will evaluate the offer for price reasonableness.

The Government intends to select one contractor for this acquisition. However, the Government reserves the right not to award a purchase order at all, depending on the quality of the quotations and prices submitted and the availability of funds.

The Government will evaluate quotes based on the LPTA criteria. Only the lowest priced offer will be evaluated for Technical Acceptability. Should the lowest priced offer not be technical acceptable, the process will continue in order of lowest priced offer until the LPTA offer is identified.

Rejection of Unreasonable Offers: The Government may reject any quotation that is evaluated to be unreasonably high or low in cost when compared to Government estimates, such that the quotation is deemed to reflect an inherent lack of competence or failure to comprehend the requirement.

If the Contractor is unable to comply with the requirement to use IPP for submitting invoices for payment, the Contractor must submit a waiver request in writing to the Contracting Officer with its proposal or quotation.

The vendor must submit an invoice for payment no later than 30 calendar days after the end of the month of performance of services for each month services are performed. The vendor must notify the contracting officer in writing if the invoice will not be submitted within the specified time frame. Invoices must be submitted electronically. Hard copies of invoices will not be processed.
