

This is a combined synopsis/solicitation for commercial items prepared in accordance with Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Subpart 12.6, as supplemented with additional information included in this notice. The Naval Surface Warfare Center Carderock Division (NSWCCD) intends to solicit only one source under the authority of FAR Part 13.106-1(b) the Contracting Officer has determined that circumstances of the contract action deem only one source reasonably available. The Government intends to solicit with **Entech Signs – Alpha LED, LLC** for **disassembly, removal, replacement and testing of the digital sign panels on Naval Surface Warfare Center- Carderock Division’s main entrance digital information sign**. The NAICS code is 339950 and the Small Business Standard is 500 employees.

The provisions and clauses included and/or incorporated in this solicitation document are those in effect through the Federal Acquisition Circular. Information received will normally be considered solely for the purpose of determining whether to conduct a competitive procurement. All responses shall include price(s), FOB point, a point of contact, name and phone number, GSA contract number (if applicable), business size, and payment terms. Each response must clearly indicate the capability of the quoter to meet all specifications and requirements.

PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT**Electronic Sign Panel Replacement**

- 1.0 DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES/INTRODUCTION:** The contractor shall provide all labor, materials, equipment, transportation, supervision, and non-personal services to replace the existing electronic sign panels with new panels.
- 2.0 BACKGROUND:** The Naval Surface Warfare Center- Carderock Division (NSWCCD) currently uses a large digital sign at the main entrance to provide public notifications to the civilian, military, contractor and visiting personnel on site. This large sign is due for panel updates, as the current signs are end of life and starting to fail.
- 3.0 OBJECTIVE:** The contractor shall perform the disassembly, removal, replacement and testing of the digital panels on the sign.
- 3.1** The contractor shall perform the disassembly and removal of the existing panel. All connections shall be disconnected in a manner that does not damage or destroy the existing wiring and connections.

- 3.2 Once all existing electronic panels have been removed from the exterior of the sign, the contractor shall install two new LED panels in accordance with the specification in attachment 1 to the sign. Panels shall be installed in a manner that does not destroy or damage the existing electronic components. Installation shall include performance testing to ensure proper function. Installation shall include necessary weatherproofing to avoid water and debris intrusion into the electronic components or the body of the sign.
- 3.3 Once all electronics have been performance tested to ensure the panels are operating as intended, the contractor shall demonstrate any variances between the new panels and the old panels.
- 3.4 The contractor shall remove all debris and the old panels from the site and properly dispose of them.
- 3.5 The contractor shall provide any software, hardware, and firmware necessary for the existing infrastructure to work with the new panels.

4.0 SPECIAL QUALIFICATIONS:

- 4.1 Contractor personnel shall be qualified to work on the sign without voiding the remaining Entech Signs warranty on other components of the sign.

CLAUSES INCORPORATED BY FULL TEXT

52.204-24 REPRESENTATION REGARDING CERTAIN TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND VIDEO SURVEILLANCE SERVICES OR EQUIPMENT (NOV 2021)

The Offeror shall not complete the representation at paragraph (d)(1) of this provision if the Offeror has represented that it "does not provide covered telecommunications equipment or services as a part of its offered products or services to the Government in the performance of any contract, subcontract, or other contractual instrument" in paragraph (c)(1) in the provision at 52.204-26, Covered Telecommunications Equipment or Services-- Representation, or in paragraph (v)(2)(i) of the provision at 52.212-3, Offeror Representations and Certifications-- Commercial Products and Commercial Services. The Offeror shall not complete the representation in paragraph (d)(2) of this provision if the Offeror has represented that it "does not use covered telecommunications equipment or services, or any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services" in paragraph (c)(2) of the provision at 52.204-26, or in paragraph (v)(2)(ii) of the provision at 52.212-3.
