Snowplow shall be designed for use on a Deere 544K Loader SN *1DW554KZECE646418*

GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS

- I. The Snowplow will be the newest model available, and will be clear of any defects or imperfections
2. The Snowplow shall be manufactured and delivered to ensure a complete hookup and operation with the Forest Service owned Deere 544K Loader.
3. All materials and components comprising the 11' Snowplow, will be equal or like kind to Hennke SDDDB11
4. The delivery needs be FOB, new and complete to 500 N Mission St. McCall, ID 83638

SNOW PLOW SPECIFICATIONS

1. The Snowplow shall have a minimum cutting width of 11' at 0 degree rotation and 9' width at 35 degree rotation.
2. The plow moldboard will be made out of a minimum of ¼" steel.
3. The plow must weight a minimum of 3,700 lbs.
4. The plow shall have hydraulic rotation operated by two cylinders infinitely adjustable from 0 to 35 degrees both ways.
5. Coupler and hydraulics must be compatible with Deere 544K with SN *1DW554KZECE646418*. Supplier is responsible for proving this compatibility before manufacturing.
