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STATEMENT OF WORK

Purpose: Document disposal services for Portsmouth Naval Shipyard (PNS), Kittery, ME

Period of Performance: One full year contract with two Options set up in 1-year increments.

Scope: Perform document destruction of documents up to and including documents classified as Secret.

1. Vendor shall use a mobile shredder/disintegrator capable of Level 6 (P-7) shredding.
2. Destruction services shall be performed onsite at PNS adjacent to Building 298 at a minimum of one day per week for 8 hours.

Security Clearance: Vendor will be required to have a minimum of a Secret facility clearance and all personnel working this contract will require a Tier 3 investigation and a favorably adjudicated Secret clearance issued through the Defense Security Service in accordance with reference (a). The tier 3 Investigation shall be maintained current within 5-years and requests for Secret Periodic Reinvestigations shall be initiated by submitting a Tier 3R investigation prior to the 5 year anniversary date of the previous Tier 3 Investigation. A Visit Request listing with each cleared employee authorized to process Portsmouth Naval Shipyard material is required each year. At no time will a third party nor a non-cleared person facilitate the handling and destruction of Portsmouth Naval Shipyard material.

Equipment:

1. The disintegrator/shredder shall be capable of destroying documents to requirements set forth by reference (b) and the NSA/CSS Evaluated Products List (EPL) of reducing paper documents to meet Level 6 (P-7) shredding requirements. 100% of the collected material will be destroyed via disintegration-approved equipment contained in the applicable NSA EPL.
2. Per reference (b); Effective January 1, 2011, only equipment listed on an evaluated products list (EPL) issued by NSA may be used to destroy classified information using any method covered by an EPL. EPLs currently exist for paper shredders/disintegrators, punched tape destruction devices, optical media destruction devices (for compact discs (CDs) and digital video discs (DVDs)), degaussers (for magnetic media sanitization), and disintegrators (for paper and punched tape material).
3. NSA/CSS Evaluated Products List for Paper Disintegrators; The device must reduce paper and/or punched tape to an edge size of 3 millimeter by 5 millimeter, or less.
4. NSA/CSS Evaluated Products List for Paper Shredders; The device must reduce paper and/or punched tape to an edge size of 1 millimeter by 5 millimeter, or less.
5. NSA/CSS Evaluated Products List; <https://www.nsa.gov/Resources/Media-Destruction-Guidance/NSA-Evaluated-Products-Lists-EPLs/>
6. On-site destruction should be fully self-contained with no external power source required.
7. While most of the material to be destroyed is paper, the disintegration process must handle paper, cardboard, Mylar, vellum, floppy disks, video cassettes, audio cassettes, CD-ROM platters, DVD platters, microfilm and microfiche. The process must handle staples, paperclips, comb-binds, snap-binds (plastic) and spiral binds (plastic).

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Shredding specifications:

1. The material shall be destroyed in accordance with 32 CFR 2001.47 and the destruction equipment standards in accordance with 32 CFR 2001.42 and Reference (c). See <https://www.nsa.gov/Resources/Media-Destruction-Guidance/> and any CSA provided guidance for additional information. Classified material destruction shall be in accordance with reference (b) and controlled unclassified material destruction shall be in accordance with reference (d). If services are ordered from an existing NAVSEA Contract vehicle such as a BPA contract, then follow reference (e) policy.
2. At the conclusion of shredding, the contractor will allow the appointed PNS employee to inspect the vehicle to validate all material was destroyed completely.

Period of Performance: The schedule for this service will be once per week between the hours of 0700-1530 for one full year from the award start date of contract. Request start of DDMMYYYY with options to renew annually for two option years thereafter.

Location of services are on-site at Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, Kittery, ME.

Information Security: In no event shall the contractor leave any Government facility under this contract with un-shredded material. In case of equipment breaking down during shredding operations, the operator shall coordinate with the Technical Points of Contact (TPOC) for instructions on how to handle any un-shredded documents.

NAID (National Association for Information Destruction) and Government Training Requirements: The contractor shall be NAID certified. Proof of NAID certification must be maintained during the entire life of the contract, and made available to the TPOC upon request.

After award and before start of contract the contractor shall be required to have all personnel requiring a government identification badge who shall be performing the work to complete the governments "Safeguarding Classified Information in the NISP IS109.16" training. The industry contractor is required to create an account at <https://cdse.usalearning.gov/login/index.php> and register for the course. The course is estimated to take 150 minutes. Personnel taking the training shall be required to sign for completion of the training. Completion of the training shall be required as part of the badging process and is an annual training requirement.

Safety Requirements:

1. "Per FAR 22.102-1(a) entitled "Safety", Contractors are hereby informed that their employees or representatives present on property under PNS cognizance must follow Federal and State OSHA requirements OSHE OSHECM Chapter Hazardous Energy Control (HEC) requirements or safety requirements for site specific location of the contract.
2. Contractors and Non-PNS Government Agencies (NPGAs) are hereby informed that their employees or representatives present on property under PNS cognizance must adhere to Federal OSHA requirements for hazardous energy control IAW 29 CFR 1915.89 and must follow Hazardous Energy Control (HEC) procedures as identified in NAVSEA's Occupational Safety, Health, and Environment Corporate Manual (OSHECM) Chapter 250 (latest revision), when performing work under PNS contract. All HEC work to be performed by Contractors and NPGAs requires that PNS TPOCs and/or Contracting Officer's Representatives (CORs) be notified of the HEC scope of work prior to starting work. Any changes or deviations in the initial scope of HEC work requires the PNS TPOCs and/or CORs be informed of the change/deviation. Appendix 250.B-1 through B-3 of OSHECM Chapter 250 for multiple employer work identifies when

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Contractors and NPGAs are required to assign their Lockout/Tags-Plus Coordinator (LOTC) to coordinate HEC work with the cognizant PNS LOTC. HEC locks shall be provided by the contractor or NPGA for their employees use. The HEC locks shall have red bodies with name labels or name tags affixed, identifying who installed the HEC lock(s) and a point of contact telephone number. HEC lock name labels and tags must be made of materials that will hold up to the environment to which they are exposed. HEC tags used for Tags-Plus HEC work shall be provided by the cognizant PNS LOTC to the contractor or NPGA for their use if machinery, equipment, or systems (MES) cannot be locked out. OSHECM Chapter 250 Tags-Plus procedures will be strictly followed.
